<b>CO63/25</b>	<b>PUBLIC SESSION</b> There were no members of the public present.	
<b>CO64/25</b>	<b>APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE</b>  Apologies were noted from; Councillor Caroline Rogers (prior engagement), Councillor Rebecca Wilczek (illness) <b>RESOLVED:</b> (i) The apologies be noted.	<b>Clerk</b>
<b>CO65/25</b>	<b>MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING</b> <b>RESOLVED:</b> <b>That;</b> (i) The minutes of the Full Council Meeting held on 2 September 25 be signed as a true record.	
<b>CO66/25</b>	<b>Clerk &amp; Officers Update</b> The Clerk had circulated a written report. She highlighted that: (i) The Network Rail lease is now in a format that the Council are comfortable to sign. Further fees have been incurred to allow statutory searches to be carried out. (ii) All planters across the parish have been planted up with Winter bedding.	

	<p>(iii) Hannah Liddle, the Parish Business Administration apprentice has now started and will be working her way through both the college portfolio and parish related tasks.</p> <p>(iv) Work has started on the Active Travel Corridor in the Parish. There is quite a lot of disruption and a section of Station Road will be closed for 3 to 8 weeks.</p> <p>(v) Due to ongoing construction works in Bedlington Station an event has been organised in East Bedlington Community Centre to celebrate switching on the festive lighting.</p> <p>(vi) A member of the public has raised awareness of a new government initiative to create the first Town of Culture. A suggestion was made that both East and West Bedlington Councils could work together on a bid. It was noted that all bids could only have one lead organisation. Whilst members were supportive of the initiative the capacity of the officers to deliver a £3.5m programme of events would be challenging, bearing in mind current projects. The Chairman added that this may be a project that the four NCC Councillors could explore or indeed the newly reformed Bedlingtonshire Development Trust.</p> <p>(vii) <b>Bonfire</b> – the Clerk updated members on the unsafe bonfire which had been built in the Oval. As advised by the Neighbourhood Policing Team, Bernicia are planning to remove the structure early am 5 November. Sgt Ridsdale introduced himself and the Bedlington Station Neighbourhood Beat Officer. He advised that now he is in post he will be calling into the Centre more frequently and sending regular updates. 	<p>Councillor Murphy enquired about the electric bikes purchased by NCC Councillors and if they were being used. The officers advised they had been used in the summer in Gallagher Park and that one bike is awaiting repair. She also requested feedback on Force policy on the use of the bikes. The officers advised that the use of drones was the most effective emerging tool but they needed members of the public to come forward with information with regards to properties where anti social or illegal activities were taking place. They advised that they also struggled to promote successes in seizing off road bikes and successful drugs raids. The Chairman advised that any publicity sent to the Parish office would be circulated on our social media channels.
